

LAKE MONTFORT SCHOOL- BENGALURU- JULY TO NOVEMBER -2025

Prayerful greetings from Lake Montfort School. We are delighted to share a recap of the dynamic activities and events that took place between July to November 2025. These initiatives were designed to create a vibrant campus atmosphere and enhance the daily learning experience making it both more engaging and productive for our students.

1. SOCIAL SCIENCE CLUB COMPETITION- (HIGH SCHOOL): The Social Science Club Competition was held from 2 to 4 July 2025 to promote cultural and historical awareness. Grade 6 performed historical role plays, Grades 7–8 designed logos on Indian culture, and Grades 9–10 created cartoons on the Indian education system. The finale on 4 July showcased top entries, all using eco-friendly materials, celebrating creativity, heritage, and national pride.



2. MATHS CLUB COMPETITION- (PRIMARY SCHOOL): The Mathematics Department held an interactive club competition for the Primary Block to strengthen students' logical reasoning, numerical skills, and spatial understanding. Preliminary rounds were conducted in July, and the finals were held on 3 July 2025. Grade 1 students enjoyed Solve the Grid, Grades 2 and 3 created and explained 3-D shapes, and Grades 4 and 5 tackled Brain Busters puzzles. The event offered a fun, hands-on way for students to apply math concepts and develop a genuine interest in numbers.



3. 28 ANNUAL SPORTS DAY OF LAKE MONTFORT SCHOOL: The 28th Annual Sports Day of Lake Montfort School, LAMOS 2025, was celebrated with great enthusiasm on 12 July 2025. The Chief Guest, Mrs. Bindu Rani G, former athlete and athletic coach, was warmly welcomed by the School Band, the Director and Principal Rev. Dr. Bro. Antony Samy A, and other dignitaries. The event began with a soulful Prayer Song and a graceful Welcome Dance. The hoisting of the School and Olympic flags, followed by the impressive March Past by the four houses, set a proud beginning. The Lighting of the Olympic Torch further ignited the spirit of sportsmanship. Students then competed in various athletic events—races, relays, jumps, and throws—cheered on by peers and teachers. Performances such as the Mass Drill (Grades 4–5), Aerobics Display (Grade 6), and Yogasana presentation (Grade 7) added rhythm and elegance. In her motivating address, the Chief Guest praised the discipline of the students and highlighted the importance of sports in building resilience, teamwork, and character. The ceremony concluded with a warm Vote of Thanks and the National Anthem, bringing the celebration to a dignified close. Montfort House claimed the title of Overall Champion, with Joseph House as Runners-Up.



4. DEPARTMENTAL MEETINGS: Director & Principal Rev. Bro. Antony Samy conducted departmental meetings on **22 to 26 July 2025** focusing on academic improvement, teaching methodology, curriculum delivery, digital integration, and CBSE compliance. Departments highlighted key strategies: English emphasized grammar, creative writing, digital lessons, and higher-order thinking skills; Mathematics focused on conceptual understanding, problem-solving, and CBSE-format questions; Languages targeted pronunciation, vocabulary, writing, and cultural integration; Science promoted inquiry-based learning and hands-on experiments; Social Science linked content to current events using mind maps, timelines, and debates; Arts, Music, Dance, and PE planned thematic and cross-disciplinary activities to enhance engagement. HODs were tasked with monitoring curriculum progress, lesson plans, and smart board usage, while teachers ensured lesson compliance, digital content, and effective delivery. A feedback form assessed performance and challenges, reinforcing coordination and commitment to academic excellence.

5. REVIEW MEET FOR GRADE 1 TO 5 (PRIMARY BLOCK): The Primary Block Teachers' Preview Meeting was held on 28 July 2025, led by Rev. Bro. Antony appreciated teachers' dedication and emphasized collaboration and continuous improvement. Key areas reviewed included textbook availability, structured lesson plans, effective use of digital tools, interactive teaching with support for slow learners, age-appropriate discipline and homework, organized ECA and library use, syllabus tracking, handwriting and punctuality, CBSE-aligned exams, clear parent communication, adherence to timetables, student behaviour guidance, regular teacher training, safety in classrooms and transport, and strict uniform norms. The meet concluded with encouragement to continue working for students' holistic development.



6. ARTIFEX – GRAND FINALE CELEBRATION OF PERFORMING AND VISUAL ARTS: The much-awaited finale of ARTIFEX, the school’s annual celebration of the performing and visual arts, brought vibrant energy and creativity to the campus from **29 July to 31 July 2025**. The event showcased the incredible talent of students across all grades in the fields of dance, music, art, and dramatics, blending tradition, innovation, and expression into one spectacular platform.



7. Main Block Highlights: Students from Grades 6 to 12 took part in a variety of creative competitions. Dance events saw Grades 6–8 perform Retro-themed Solo and Group dances, while Grades 9–12 showcased energetic Bollywood routines. Music competitions featured soulful Solo and Group singing across both grade bands. In Art, Grades 6–8 created Wealth Out of Waste projects, and Grades 9–12 impressed with expressive Hand Painting. The event concluded with entertaining and meaningful Mad Ads by senior students. ARTIFEX celebrated student creativity, teamwork, and performance.

8. MEETING WITH SUPPORT STAFF AND TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT: A meeting with the Support Staff and Transport Department was held on 2 August 2025, led by Director and Principal Rev. Bro. Antony Samy, to acknowledge their vital role and set expectations for the academic term. He stressed discipline, punctuality, cleanliness, teamwork, and child safety, appreciating their dedication and reminding them of the importance of every role. The session reinforced hygiene, respectful communication, and strict safety protocols, renewing their commitment to maintaining a safe and well-managed school environment.

9. MGA AND PORTAL MEETING: A meeting with the **MGA Team** was held on 7 August 2025 at 12:30 PM, to discuss their roles and plans for the term and upcoming edition. The **MGA Team**, which oversees catechism and value education classes, shared plans for activities aimed at instilling moral values, ethics, and life lessons among students. The focus was on making sessions more interactive and engaging, helping students reflect on real-life situations and develop strong character.



10. IN MEMORIAM: REV. BRO. LAWRENCE JOSEPH (1935–2025)

LMS has lost one of its rare gems and a true treasure in the passing of Rev. Bro. Lawrence Joseph, who peacefully departed on August 15, 2025, at the age of 91. Bro. Lawrence was a shining example of faith, humility, and unwavering dedication a Brother whose life enriched the Montfortian mission and inspired all who had the privilege to know him. Throughout his long and fruitful journey, Bro. Lawrence served in many vital roles as a teacher, formator, Principal, Provincial Superior, and Vicar General leaving behind a legacy marked by wisdom, compassion, and tireless commitment to education and spiritual formation. His profound love for the Congregation and its heritage touched generations, making him a beacon of light and hope. Following his passing, teaching, non-teaching, and support staff gathered at the school to pay their last respects, honouring a Brother whose impact on LMS and beyond will never be forgotten and will always be cherished.



11. PRINCIPAL'S MEET WITH STUDENTS OF GRADES 9 TO 12: On 20 August 2025, Rev. Bro. Antony Samy, the Director and Principal, met with students of Grades 9 to 12 to review their recent academic performance. The meeting aimed to reflect on the outcomes of the Pre-Midterm Exams (Grades 9 & 10), Monthly Test 2 (Grade 11), and Cycle Test 2 (Grade 12). He highlighted areas for improvement—time management, conceptual clarity, answer presentation, and consistent revision—while motivating students to take ownership of their learning through disciplined, focused study and active classroom participation. Teachers were instructed to provide targeted support, adopt interactive methods, conduct regular revisions, track progress, and collaborate for holistic student development. The meeting concluded with renewed commitment from both students and staff toward academic growth and excellence.

12. COMPUTER CLUBS FINALS: The Computer Club competition on 21 August 2025 featured events across grade levels to showcase technical skills and creativity. Grade 6 took part in Machine Vision, Grades 7–8 in Weber, Grades 9–10 in Codifies, and Grades 11–12 in Troubleshooter, each testing different computer and problem-solving abilities. The event encouraged learning, collaboration, and innovation, motivating students to further explore technology and computer science.

13. FRENCH CLUB FINALS: The French Club Competition is scheduled to be held on 28 August 2025 for students of Grades 8, 9, and 10 (II Language). Grade 8 students presented on the topic "Les Portraits Français" (Famous French Personalities), showcasing their understanding of notable figures from French

history and culture through creative expression. Students of Grades 9 and 10 explored the theme "Le Quotidien" (Daily Life), focusing on everyday routines, habits, and aspects of life in French-speaking regions. The event aims to encourage language skills, cultural awareness, and confident communication among learners, offering them a platform to apply their knowledge beyond the classroom.



14. SANSKRIT CLUB COMPETITION: The Sanskrit Club Competition was held on **29 August 2025** for students of Grades 6 to 10. Grades 6 and 7 to 8 (II Language) participated in Poem Recitation, demonstrating pronunciation, expression, and fluency in Sanskrit. Grades 9–10 competed in Storytelling, narrating short Sanskrit stories with clarity and creativity. The event aimed to cultivate appreciation, interest, and confidence in one of the world's oldest languages.



15. SEMINAR for GRADE 9: A seminar on Self-Management was conducted for Grade 9 students, led by psychologists Ms. Tisha Jain and Mr. Akash Mathew from FlipSide Story, Mysore on **30 August 2025**. The session focused on Time Management, Task Management using the Eisenhower Matrix, and Emotion Management through journaling, storytelling, and breathing exercises. Principal Rev. Bro. Dr. Antony Samy A and Vice-Principal Mr. Somashekharaiyah D S felicitated the facilitators. Interactive activities encouraged students to reflect on habits, prioritise tasks, and manage emotions effectively. The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks and equipped students with practical strategies for personal and academic growth.



16. RETREAT for GRADE 6 to 9: On 30 August 2025, Lake Montfort School hosted a spiritually enriching retreat for Catholic students of Grades 6 to 9 held in the peaceful setting of the School Chapel. 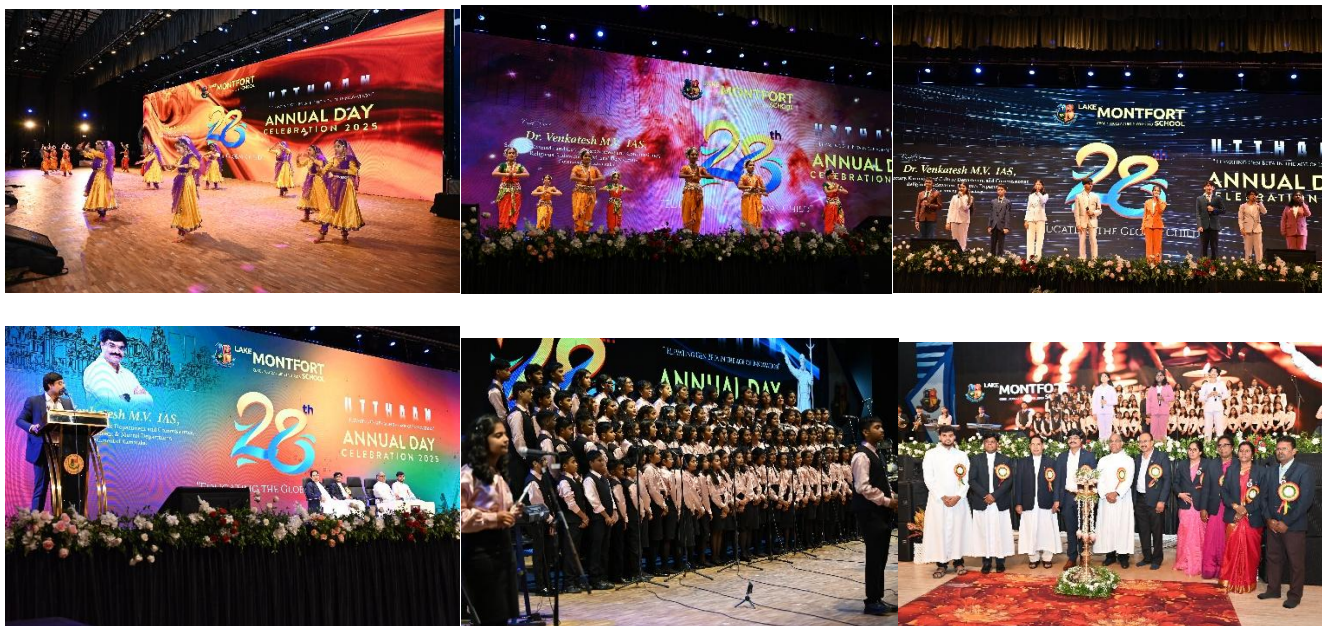
