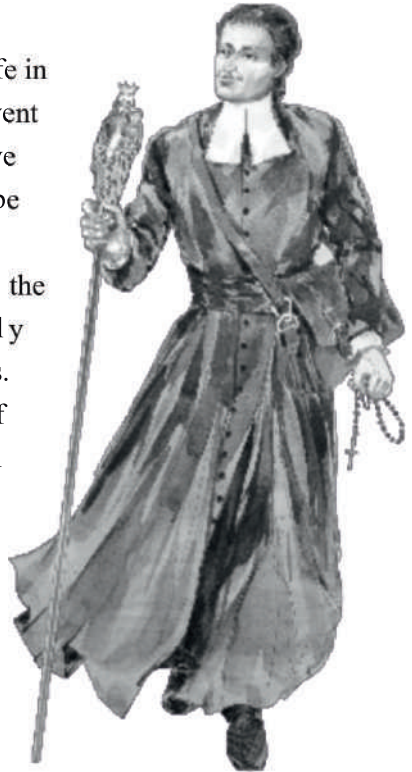

SAINT MONTFORT PATRON OF THE SCHOOL

His full name is Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort. In fact, the Patron Saint of our school was born in a town called MONTFORT in North Western France on 31 January 1673. From his very early childhood he led a virtuous life. He was service minded and showed an extraordinary love for the poor. He had to undergo many trials and tribulations due to this, but he came out of it all with faith, conviction and courage, trusting entirely in God, keeping with his watchword “God Alone”. He admired and loved Mary the most saintly Mother of Jesus, and hence the addition of 'Marie' to his name.

He became a priest and dedicated his life in the service of God and Humanity. He went from place to place preaching God's love and compassion and the need for us to be always at the service of others. His students were mostly the poor and the oppressed and he successfully championed their cause against all odds. In his love for the poor he abased himself so much that he looked rather rugged in appearance. Though his detractors persecuted him to the optimum level, the poor venerated him. He won a special place in their hearts.



Montfort was a great scholar, poet, author of many spiritual books and a powerful orator. He was also an artist gifted in painting and sculpture. The creations of this artist-poet continue to inspire people even today.

Montfort was a great educationist. He founded schools largely in favor of the poor. His methods were very practical and, with hard work and great perseverance, he could very effectively provide education for many young minds. He founded three charitable and religious societies to carry on his good works. One such is the Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel which carried on his mission of education for three hundred years till date. He died at an early age of 43 on 28 April 1716. Currently, the Montfort Brothers educate about 2.84 million children and youth in 33 countries across the globe.

The flame of education and instruction lit by this wise and holy man glows and shines even today. After 300 years, it still continues to spread on to more territories of the world.



SCHOOL EMBLEM AND MOTTO

The School Emblem has four parts: God Alone, the Cross, the Torch, and the Book. God Alone was the most favorite watchword of Montfort. His first love was for God, the most powerful and compassionate.



He had Him always in his thoughts and he did everything in union with Him. The Cross or suffering for Montfort was always a blessing in disguise, so much so he would cry out, “No cross, what a cross!” The Torch represents the Light of Divine Truth which must guide us all through life. The Book stands for true Knowledge or Wisdom which has its source in God.

The School Motto is **“Rise and Shine!”** The student is called upon to 'rise and shine' in every phase of life. He/she has to be a beacon light to others through inspiring leadership and selfless service.

In order to achieve this, the student has to come out of the darkness of ignorance, worldly desires and attachments and, keeping his/her gaze ever on high, act as a catalyst to the rest of the world to lift it up on every front, so that it can attain a culture of freedom, peace and harmony, leading to endless realms of liberation, development and prosperity.

True, this is a highly exalted goal not attainable by all - in fact attainable only by the truly enlightened, unique and exceptional individuals. - All Saturdays will be Holiday for Pre-KG to UKG.
- Students of Grade 1 to 12 are to reach the school well before the first siren at 8:25 AM and spend the time quietly in their class rooms busy with immediate preparation for the classes.
- We work from Monday to Saturday. The official working hours is from 8:25 AM to 2:45 PM with a lunch break from 12:10 to 12:40 PM. Lunch break for the school office is from 1:00 to 1:30 PM.
- Working hours for Pre-KG to UKG will be from 8:55 AM to 12:50 PM
- The students will access the school office for any need before 8:25 AM, during breaks and after 1:55 PM.
- Students must meet the Principal/Vice Principal for getting approval for leave and other administrative work only before 8:25 AM.
- Academically weak students in particular may be required to stay for longer duration, whenever required, to attend special coaching classes.
- If students have to spend longer time at school for any reason, the matter will be intimated to their parents well in advance.

Note:

Hair style for Girls:

- **Pre-KG to UKG :** short hair (up to the ear).
- **Grade 1 to 10 :** Two plaits with straight parting, tied at the end with black hair ties.
- **Grade 11 & 12 :** Simple pony tail, tied with black hair ties.
- Fringe haircut and using more than two hair clips / pins are not allowed.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

- Wearing the school uniform to school is mandatory. Students must take good care of personal hygiene and grooming.
- No items of dress other than the prescribed ones in the stipulated form will be permitted in the class rooms and school premises. For example: hats, caps, sunglasses, jeans and so on are among the prohibited items.
- Pants and skirts must be fitted to the waist and every item of school uniform must be worn in the correct way, as prescribed by the school.
- **Fancy hairstyles including dying and coloring, nail polish and eye liner are not permitted. Boys with short and decent hair cut (not in fashionable or military cut), and girls must have their hair maintained and tied in a simple, normal and neat way.**
- Nails must be regularly and neatly cut. No student should have overgrown nails.
- No skin decorations like tattooing are allowed. Keep your skin healthy. No excuses for the defaulters.
- Piercing of any part of the body is not allowed. Normal earrings and studs (not the hanging and fancy kinds) are permitted for girls. No other ornaments whatsoever are allowed.
- Students of Pre-KG to Grade 7 are permitted to wear decent colour dress to school on their birthdays.

FEES REGULATION

School fees are charged for 12 calendar months. These fees can be paid in full or in two or three installments on the dates given below in the Federal Bank, K. R. Puram Branch. School and bus fees can also be paid online.

First Instalment /Full : Before Friday, 24 April 2026

Second Instalment : Before Wednesday, 5 August 2026

Third Instalment : Before Friday, 11 December 2026

- Fees once paid is not refundable.
- Late fee of Rs 100 per month will be charged separately for both school and bus fees.
- A student joining or leaving the school any time during the academic year will be required to pay the fees for the entire year.
- Students will be allowed to enter the class only on payment of fees on or before the stipulated dates.
- At the beginning of the academic year, no student will be enrolled for the class without payment of fees and the defaulters will not be permitted into the class rooms. This rule is strictly applicable only for the first installment (School/Bus) fees.
- Any extension of the date for payment of fees will be allowed only for exceptional cases.
- If the second or third installment of fees remains unpaid even after the due dates, the student's name will be removed from the attendance register and the defaulter will not be allowed to enter the class room.
- Subsequently a re-admission will have to be sought before the payment of fees.
- Loss of attendance due to nonpayment of fees cannot be compensated.
- Fees are liable to be increased marginally at the beginning of the academic year as per needs.

SCHOOLTRANSPORT

The school provides transport by school buses to students who are enrolled before 2020 and the pick-up points will be fixed by the school. In any case, the school is not bound to provide transport for everyone who asks for it. Parents will see if the prescribed pick up points are convenient for their child and apply for school bus service only if satisfied. Parents are requested to excuse us for any inconveniences caused due to unforeseen situations like traffic jams and unexpected interruptions in the services.

- School Bus fees are to be paid as promptly as the school fees and the same rules apply for both the cases.
- Please note that unless the fees are paid on or before the stipulated dates, the student will not be allowed to travel in the school bus.
- The student must carry with him/her the bus pass issued by the school. Boarding the school bus can be denied if the bus pass is not produced on demand and subsequently any failure can attract even a fine.
- Permission must be sought in writing for any change in the pickup and dropping points. In such situation, the bus fees calculation also will undergo appropriate alteration.
- No bus fees refund will be allowed if the student stops travelling in the school bus during the academic year. Prior intimation must be given to the school authorities if the student wants to stop using the school bus service provided by the school. If no such intimation is received, the student will be required to pay the entire bus fees for the term, even if the bus facility was not used.
- As a general rule, once the student has enrolled to travel in the school bus, he/she is bound to pay the bus fees for the entire year.
- Any student asking for the bus facility during the course of the year will be required to pay the bus fees for the whole year, or at least the term fees if joining in the second/third term.
- Nonpayment of the School/Bus fees can result in denial of the bus facility.

SOME GENERAL RULES

Rules are necessary because of our ignorance of the right code of conduct. In fact no human society can survive without rules and legitimate authority. The school community consists mainly of children and teenagers. They are in the initial stages of growth and development and so it is necessary that they should be properly guided to learn things in the right way. Rules are only tools in this process and must be respected so that the student can achieve the purpose for which he/she is placed in the school by his/her parents. In fact every stage in life has rules proper to it. All schools generally have very similar rules.

- The students should at all times show immense respect to the school authorities and members of the staff. They will ensure to greet them appropriately at any given moment. Their behavior towards everyone will always be courteous and polite.
- Punctuality and cleanliness are the hallmarks of all well behaved students. They should keep the campus and school spaces especially the class rooms clean and make proper use of trash bins.
- Be regular and punctual in whatever you do. Do your duties at the right time, in the right place, with thoroughness and neatness. Be very pure in thought, word and deed.
- Be truthful at all times, and be honest especially during tests, examinations and submission of assignments. Do not be afraid or wary of speaking the truth.
- Take care of the school property. Do not cause any damage to building, furniture, electrical wires, electric and electronic equipment, computers in the lab, library books, sports utilities etc. Treat not only the school property but also the property of fellow students with care.
- If you are found to be the cause of any such damage, you will be required to compensate for the loss in cash or kind.
- Take an active part in all curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the school. Some such activities may be allowed only with a written requisition from your parents. Participate actively and wholeheartedly in classroom activities, too.

- Complete your classwork, homework, projects, lab work and other assignments well on time as per the schedule given by your teacher. Any failure to complete these responsibilities will entail a proportionate loss in marks. The subject teacher will be maintaining a cumulative record for the same.
- The student identity card must be worn properly at all times in such a manner that your identity can be verified by anyone standing in front of you.
- Speak in English at all times on the campus and during school trips, off the campus.

GENERAL CODES OF CONDUCT

- Possession of materials of low moral value (like offensive periodicals, books, objects, CDs, tapes, and so on) is not permitted inside the school.
- Groupism is evil and all associated activities such as organizing or attending unauthorized meetings in the school campus or collection of funds, printing related articles, books, leaflets, T-shirts and cloth items are forbidden.
- Students are cautioned not to bring valuables such as gold chains, cameras, I-Pod, I-Pad, Discman, costly watches or other such articles to the school. The school will not be responsible for the loss of such goods. In general, it is the responsibility of the students to take care of their personal belongings.
- Students are not allowed to possess or use cell phones in the school campus. If any such gadget is found, it will be confiscated.
- Underage students riding motor cycles without valid driving license, in school uniform both on and off the campus is strictly prohibited. This rule is particularly aimed at promoting safety of all concerned.
- Students using bicycles should lock it after parking at the allotted place. Bicycle riding is not permitted inside the school premises.
- Every student must bring the Handbook to class and keep it neat and secure. It contains detailed information regarding the teaching-learning process of the school.
- Repeated violation of school rules will lead to disciplinary action.

CLASSROOM DECORUM

- Students will ensure that the tables and benches are properly placed and litters are not strewn around.
- While debate and discussion are useful for learning, students must ensure that they do not disturb the adjacent classes.
- While teaching is in progress, no student should talk, move around or disturb the teacher or other students.
- Students are not permitted to consume water or foodstuff when the class is in progress.
- Students are prohibited to consume chewing gum and aerated drinks in class or in the campus.
- Students leaving the class on account of illness must take a permission slip duly signed by the teacher in the class for submitting to the school nurse.
- Class Prefects must ensure that all windows are closed, lights and fans are switched off when leaving the class for outdoor or other school activities or at the end of the day.
- No student should play in the class room or in the corridor during breaks.

SCHOOL LEAVE POLICY AND ATTENDANCE

Students are expected to participate earnestly in all activities of the school, except in the event of serious illness or emergencies. The Leave Policy of the School is:

1. Every student is expected to be present in the school on the first day of each Term till the last day of the Term. A minimum of 95% attendance is required for a promotion to the next Grade.
2. Students will not be granted leave while the school is in session. Students will not be permitted to extend their holidays beyond those listed in the school calendar of the school handbook.
3. The following exemptions may be granted:
 - Death, life threatening illness or serious accident met with by an immediate family member, like parents or siblings.

- Student's own serious illness, determined after consultation with the family physician.
 - Students taking competitive or entrance examinations.
 - Students participating in sports or cultural competitions.
 - Other emergencies as judged by the Principal.
4. In an emergency, parent or guardian will have to take prior permission for leave for the student with an application addressed to the Principal.
 5. When a student is absent from school, his / her parent must call the school on the day of absence and the student must bring an application for leave from the parent stating the cause, the exact date(s) of the absence on returning to school and get the leave approved by the Principal/VP/Supervisor before entering the class room. The parent must also enter details of the leave applied for in the leave record section of the student handbook which must also be presented by the student to the Principal/VP/Supervisor for endorsement along with the leave letter. Further, the student must present the approved leave letter and the leave record in the handbook to the Class Teacher during class time.
 6. Continued absence by students for more than 3 days without any information or prior permission will result in appropriate action.
 7. When a student is absent due to illness for 3 or more days, a medical certificate must be brought on the day of return.
 8. Work missed during absence must be made up. It is the student's responsibility to approach the respective teachers for missed assignments. Any absence will affect the learning process and can affect the student's academic grade.
 9. Time spent outside the school premises for school sponsored activities is not considered as absence. This includes field trips, excursions, inter-school competitions and school programmes.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION (GRADE 1 to 8)

1. The assessment structure and examination for Grade 1 to 8 comprises of two terms i.e., Term I and Term II.

Term I (May/June - September)

The progress of the pupil is assessed by means of One Periodic Test carrying 40 Marks which is compulsory. An average of 10% (10 Marks) of the Periodic Test, Notebook Submission (5 Marks) and Subject Enrichment Activity (5 Marks) also will be added to 80 Marks of Half Yearly Examination which will be conducted at the end of Term I.

Term II (October - March)

Two Periodic Tests carrying 20 Marks each are compulsory. An average of 10% (10 Marks) of the Two Periodic Tests, Notebook Submission (5 Marks) and Subject Enrichment Activity (5 Marks) also will be added to 80 Marks of Annual Examination which will be conducted at the end of Term II covering 10% (Grade 1 to 6), 20% (Grade 7), 30% (Grade 8) of Term I syllabus+entire syllabus of Term II.

2. Co-Scholastic activities consist of Work Education, Art Education, Health and Physical Education.
3. The students will also be assessed for discipline which will be based on the following areas like attendance, sincerity, behavior, values, tidiness and adherence to the rules and regulations of the school.
4. Parents are requested to follow up the performance of their wards in the Periodic Tests, Half Yearly Examination and Annual Examination from the very beginning of the academic year.
5. The decision of the Principal is final with regard to promotion as per norms.
6. Students absent for any of the examinations without valid reasons or prior permission will not be considered for promotion to the next grade.
7. **Re-exam will be held only for those students who represented the school for some competitions or programmes during the days of examinations. No re-exam will be conducted for others.**

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION (GRADE 9 & 10)

1. The progress of the pupil is assessed by means of three Periodic Tests carrying 80 marks each in the form of Pre-Mid-Term, Mid-Term & Post-Mid-Term. An average of 10% (10 marks) of the best two tests will be added to the final result. Notebook Submission (5 Marks) and Subject Enrichment Activity (5 Marks), also will be added to final result. The Annual Examination is conducted for 80 marks covering the entire portions.
2. Co-Scholastic Activities consist of Work Education, Art Education, Health and Physical Education.
3. Revision Exams / Review Test for Grade 9 to 12 will be conducted before the commencement of the respective Exams.
4. Parents are requested to follow up the performance of their wards in the Periodic Tests and Annual Examination from the very beginning of the academic year.
5. The decision of the Principal is final with regard to promotion as per norms.
6. Students absent for any of the examinations without a valid reason or prior permission will not be considered for promotion to the next grade.
7. **Re-exam will be held only for those students who represented the school for some competitions or programmes during the days of examinations. No re-exam will be conducted for others.**
8. The students will also be assessed for discipline which will be based on the following areas like attendance, sincerity, behavior, values, tidiness and adherence to the rules and regulations of the school.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF LEADERS

School Pupil Leader (SPL) and Assistant School Pupil Leader (ASPL)

- The SPL and ASPL must ensure that the student leaders carry out their duties in a responsible and impartial manner. They must ensure discipline during prayer, before and after class, at assemblies and at all school gatherings.
- They must be constantly vigilant and sensitive to the needs of the school, and act promptly, after consulting and getting directives from the Principal.
- They must show exemplary behavior with head held high, providing a shining example of Leadership, Trust, Courtesy, Love and Goodness.
- They must receive visitors, parents and others during school functions, activities, and Inter- School Competitions.
- They must play an active role in organizing all Inter-Class and Inter-School Activities.
- They must bring to the notice of teachers serious day to day problems of students like fights, misunderstandings, injuries, damage to school property, missing articles etc.

SCHOOL BUS

1. Only students holding a valid bus pass will be allowed to board the school bus.
2. Each bus is assigned a Teacher In-charge who will be responsible for all matters concerning that bus.
3. Parents must interact with the Teacher In-charge in case of any emergency requests.
4. All school buses will have a mobile phone and the number will be intimated to the parents concerned.
5. Be at the assigned bus stop at least 5 minutes before pick-up time in the morning and be punctual to board the bus after school.
6. Please inform Teacher In-charge in advance if you are likely to be absent from school.
7. Show respect for private property near the bus stop.

8. Respond politely when reasonable and pertinent requests are made by the bus driver / conductor.
9. Keep the aisle of the bus clear of your bags and other belongings.
10. Remain seated while the bus is moving.
11. Always maintain silence in the bus.
12. Refrain from conduct that may divert the driver's attention. Remember that such conduct can endanger the safety of others in the bus.
13. Your safety requires that you do not keep your head and arms out of the doors and windows of the bus.
14. Produce bus pass whenever asked for by the driver/conductor/ Teacher In-charge.
15. A student can be deprived of the privilege of making use of the school conveyance if found misbehaving in the bus, fighting, using bad language, or indulging in any other misbehavior.

VIOLATIONS OF STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

It is necessary to provide the school personnel, parents and students with a clear understanding of the different grades of violations of school rules and the consequent disciplinary actions.

The following lists categories and define certain violations that will disrupt the school environment and institutional progress, and specify the disciplinary measures the Principal is likely to initiate. Any disciplinary action will depend on the severity and frequency of the student's misdemeanor and left to the discretion of the Principal.

Violations:

The lists of violations on the following pages are not really all-comprehensive, but only representative and illustrative. Thus, a student behaving improperly which is not mentioned in the lists, can still be subjected to disciplinary action, if his offence is judged to be of serious nature.

Level I Violations:

A level I violation is defined to be any behavior which in some way can offend the sanctity of the educational establishment that is considered as a temple of knowledge and learning.

- Not showing due respect to school authorities and teachers.
- Discourtesy in general, disruptive and rude behavior in class, disturbing teacher/other students in the class by talking, not paying attention to the teacher, sleeping in the class, unauthorized movement in class, unauthorized absence from class, improper language, lying, inappropriate dress and grooming, leaving the school without permission, speaking in vernacular language on campus and so on.

First Disciplinary Intervention:

- Discussion between teacher and student.
- Student referred to Vice-Principal/Academic Supervisor, if necessary.
- Submission of student's written apology to the Vice-Principal /Academic Supervisor, if needed.

Second Disciplinary Intervention:

- Discussion between Teacher, Student, Vice-Principal / Academic Supervisor and Principal.
- Submission of student's apology and Vice-Principal's report to the Principal's Office.
- Record maintained in Principal's Office, and parent notification.

Third Disciplinary Intervention:

- Parent notification through Principal followed by brief suspension.
- Student will get back to the Vice-Principal / Academic Supervisor for discussion at an appointed time and date.
- Student may be asked to do community service/ additional project / subject related work, service-oriented tasks.

Level II Violations:

A Level II violation is any behavior which seriously disrupts or interferes with the effective functioning of the school.

Serious lying, stealing, bullying, ragging, teasing, disturbing and distracting the students belonging to the opposite sex, damaging school property or belongings of another, misuse of internet facility (creating or viewing objectionable text or graphics, hacking other

sites or e-mail addresses), borrowing and taking money from fellow students, inappropriate display of affection, racist comments, profanity, obscene gestures and language, physical violence, fistfights with other students, causing serious injuries, unruly behavior, spreading bad rumors, unhealthy association with companions, malpractice during exams, forging signature, being disrespectful to a teacher, threatening a teacher etc. Malpractice in the exam include copying, helping others to copy in exams, exchanging answer papers and involving in any other malpractices such as altering marks.

First Disciplinary Intervention:

- Time out from class.
- Discussion between Teacher, Vice-Principal / Academic Supervisor and Principal, Parent Notification.
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice-Principal.
- Record of report maintained in Principal's Office.
- Counseling.
- Suspension (at the discretion of the Principal).
- The suspended student may be allowed to return to class after getting the necessary written assurances from the student and the parent.
- For malpractice during exam: An entry "MP" (Malpractice) in the mark column of the subject and exam involved.

Second Disciplinary Intervention:

- This measure is taken against a student who has already gone through the first disciplinary intervention and then taken back, but repeats the same misdemeanor or commits another serious offence.
- Time out from class.
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice-Principal.
- Parent Notification and Counseling.
- Expulsion / Suspension (at the discretion of the Principal).

- Students will compensate any willful damage to property and access to facilities will be withdrawn. In addition, the student will be given additional project / subject related work and service-oriented tasks.

Level III Violations:

- A Level III violation is considered to be any misbehavior of a serious nature which perilously disrupts or interferes with the effective functioning of the school.
- Such serious violation would include bringing dangerous weapons (eg. knife) to school, sexual misconduct, use of narcotic drugs, or possession of drug paraphernalia, consumption of alcohol, smoking, and other unhealthy practices that are punishable under legal and educational rules.

Disciplinary Intervention:

- Time out from class.
- Discussion between Teacher, Vice-Principal / Academic Supervisor and the Principal.
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice-Principal.
- Record of report maintained in the Principal's Office.
- Parent and police notification.
- Expulsion.

Please Note:

Sexual Offences, Use of Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, Unauthorized Photography/Video shooting and posting Photos/Videos taken in school on the internet/Social media and other such extreme offences will attract Zero Tolerance from the part of the Administration and can result in instant Disciplinary Action such as suspension / expulsion.

ANY STUDENT IDENTIFIED FOR INDULGING IN MISCONDUCT OF VERY DAMAGING NATURE WILL BE DISMISSED IMMEDIATELY FROM THE SCHOOL WITH APPROPRIATE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE INDICATING THE NATURE OF THE OFFENCE.

GUIDELINES / RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- Home is the first school and parents are the first and best teachers. No teacher can substitute the parents if parents do their duty well. The teachers continue the educational process which the parents have already begun at home. Hence, maximum understanding and co-operation between parents and the school authorities will bring out the best in every child and make the child a superior learner, achiever and discoverer.
- Parents are requested to carefully go through all the guidelines and regulations given herein and co-operate with the school in maintaining punctuality, regularity, discipline and courteous behavior of your child.

PARENT AND TEACHER MEET

- The parent - teacher meet takes place as per the dates given in the Almanac.
- Attendance of parents at the parent-teacher meetings and seminars for parents is mandatory.
- In addition, those parents who wish to meet the teachers of their child can do so from 1.50 p.m. to 2.30 p.m. with prior permission from the Principal. Further, if a parent wants to meet his child for some urgent reason during the working hours, he must kindly report to the Principal's Office and obtain the permission. In any case, parents/visitors are not permitted to go to any class room or interact with teachers or students without the permission of the Principal.
- Parents should evaluate seriously the performance of their children in Scholastic and Co-scholastic activities as well as their behaviour at school and outside.
- Parents should go through their classwork, homework, note books, lab work, projects, etc. and check whether their son / daughter is regular in completion and submission of work.
- Parents must go through the Almanac to see if there are any remarks entered regarding the child's behavior and academic performance, and please sign wherever required.

PARENT'S RELATIONSHIP WITH SCHOOL

- Parents must desire the good of the school and do whatever they can to keep up the good reputation of the institution. Parents are expected to be collaborators in bringing in an atmosphere of discipline in the Campus. They must be courteous and polite to everyone when they visit the school. We are happy that the vast majority of parents are of this disposition. At the same time we have also come across a very few rare cases of parents behaving in a non-acceptable manner. So, we need to be vigilant and if it happens that a particular parent is found interfering with the smooth functioning of the school, he/she can be persuaded to better withdraw the child from the school.
- Attempts to bring disrepute to the school by any means like bringing hostile media or persons into the school premises will be viewed with extreme gravity and if any particular parent has a hand in this despicable action, he/she will have to withdraw the child from the school.
- No parent or visitor is allowed to take photographs or use video on campus without permission from the Principal.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The Parent-Teacher Association at LMS is very active and any concern from the parents can be addressed through this association, if needed.

VARIOUS FACILITIES AT SCHOOL

Medical

Lake Montfort School has a well-equipped infirmary that can provide First Aid to students who hurt themselves or fall sick in the campus. They will be administered first aid at the school infirmary and the parent will be intimated. In case of an emergency, the parent will be informed without delay and the student will be taken to the nearest medical facility.

Laboratories

Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and Computer Labs are well equipped for practical experiments and exams.

Audio Visual Rooms & Smart Classes

These facilities are real assets to keep pace with the changing times and to make the teaching-learning process interesting and practical. They help the students to become more proficient in mastering academics. Every class room is equipped with smart boards. We have a separate audio visual room or multimedia room where we conduct co-curricular activities which require audio visual aids.

Music and Dance

Most classes have a period for music and singing on a regular basis. We have a School Band. Special coaching is provided for instrumental and vocal music. The school has well trained dance teachers. There are separate rooms provided in the school for conducting music and dance classes.

Club Activities

Clubs at the school enhance learning through interaction and discussion. It encourages each individual to cultivate and nurture a different perception of life through learning from each other, realizing value of unity, developing social skills, becoming confident and independent. We at LMS, have Subject-Oriented Clubs, which observe various activities throughout the year, providing exposure to all the blooming buds.

Sports

It is an integral part of the curriculum and the learning process at Lake Montfort School. We have sufficient Sports Infrastructure: Basketball Courts, full size Football Ground, Volleyball Court, Cricket Field and Throwball Courts, Indoor Sports Complex for Table Tennis, Indoor Exercises and Multi-Gym. Trained coaches nurture their invaluable competitive spirit and team work.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Opportunities are given to the students to participate in various competitions, sports and games, dance, music, drama and art. Students are encouraged to develop individual talents and group

Orientations. Thus, we encourage and facilitate the all-round development of the children.

Library

An extensive, spacious and well equipped library provides ample opportunities for students to cultivate the habit of reading . Students can borrow books from the library. Normally such books are returned within 15 days. Any damage done to books will have to be compensated in cash or kind.

Kids Fun Station

There is a safe Kids Fun Station meant for Pre KG to Grade 2 students. This facility is provided to make our children enjoy outdoor physical activities so that as they grow up, they will continue to be physically active and fit that will contribute towards their mental focus and alertness. Further, it is also a place for social development of our children.

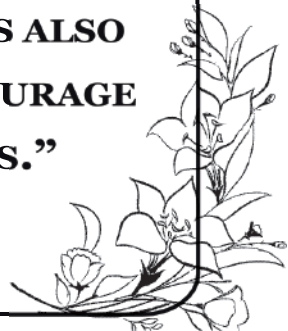
Counseling Service
